SPOTLIGHT ON THE GREAT OUTDOORS IN MEADVIEW

FINALLY, we can be assured Spring is here. Mother Nature seems to have given up her game of mixing Winter and Spring days and has now moved on to spring. We can once again engage in all those outdoor activities most of us moved to Arizona to enjoy.

Although most of the population of Meadview is considered to be retired, we are a very active group of retirees. Even in the winter we stay active doing line dancing, ballroom dancing, participating in shuffle-board and pool tournaments. When Spring arrives, we add outdoor activities to the list of things we love

to do. However, there are two groups of people who have enjoyed their sport all year long: fishermen and pickleball players. Pickleball is played three or four times a week at the MCA. You must be a member to play.

In the past several years, kayaking has become very popular in Meadview. Join the South Cove Kayakers Facebook page to be informed about paddles being planned. If you are new to kayaking, there are many experienced kayakers who will be happy to help you get started.

With reports of higher water levels, boating looks promising again. The NPS has plans to allow small watercraft such as kayaks to launch from the South Cove ramp. Larger boats will launch from the primitive ramp to the south. Please park only in designated areas to allow easier access for launching. Fishing is a year-round sport, but the large fishing derbies are usually in the Spring. Check with NPS about when and where there are fishing tournaments on Lake Mead.

Although gardening can be challenging in the Arizona summer heat, many crops can be successfully grown. Take advantage of the warm days to get a jump on gardening before the heat hits. Consider container gardening as an option for a simpler way to grow fruits and vegetables. There is a list of produce that grows well in containers on page 11.

Barbecuing and outdoor eating is back. Some restaurants in town have provided areas for al fresco dining. And don't forget about the Farmer's Markets at the Meadview Marketplace on the 1st and 2nd Saturdays from 9:00 am to noon.

There are so many choices to be outdoors now while daytime temps are still mild. Always be sure to take the safety measures for each sport. Take plenty of water, wear proper clothing and let someone know where you are going. If you are new to an activity, do it with a friend. Stay safe and have fun in the Great Outdoors of Meadview.


