## HAPPY BIRTHDAY, AMERICA!!!

*We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.*



Barbecues, parades, fireworks.....we are familiar with these popular activities of Independence Day. Independence Day is more than just barbecues, parades and fireworks. It is a celebration steeped in revolutionary history, patriotic traditions and surprising stories that shaped the United States. Independence Day is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the Declaration of Independence of the United States on July 4, 1776. The Continental Congress declared that the thirteen American colonies were no longer subject and subordinate to the monarch of Britain and were now united, free and independent states. The Congress had voted to declare independence two days earlier, on July 2, but it was not declared until July 4.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Independence Day became a federal holiday in 1870. Although Americans celebrated July 4th from the beginning, it took nearly a century for Congress to officially recognize it as a federal holiday.

Coincidentally, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the only signers of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as Presidents of the United States, died on the same day: July 4, 1826. That date was also the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. James Monroe was another president to have died on July 4 in 1831.

Fifty-six delegates signed the Declaration of Independence.

A salute of one gun for each state in the United States, called a "salute to the union," is fired on Independence Day at noon by any capable military base.

The night before the Fourth was once the focal point of celebrations with gatherings often incorporating bonfires as their centerpiece. In New England, towns competed to build towering pyramids, assembled from barrels and casks. They were lit at nightfall to usher in the celebration. The highest were in Salem, Massachusetts, with pyramids of as many as forty tiers of barrels. These made the tallest bonfires ever recorded. The custom flourished in the 19th and 20th centuries and is still practiced in some New England towns.

The “Star Spangled Banner” was written during the War of 1812, not the Revolution. And the Pledge of Allegiance wasn’t ritten until 1892. Francis Bellamy wrote the pledge for the 400th anniversary of Columbus’s arrival in America.

Americans will consume 150 million hot dogs on July 4th.

In Meadview, Independence Day is celebrated by starting the day with a Flag Raising Ceremony at the VFW at 11:00 am followed by a hamburger and hot dog lunch. There will be a “double header” party at the Fisherman’s Landing on Friday, July 4 and Saturday, July 5. Remember, fireworks of any kind are not allowed in Meadview. We are inside the boundaries of the Lake Mead National Recreational Area. Because this is a national park, we are subject to the rules of the park. There will be a fireworks display at the Mohave County Fairgrounds in Kingman that starts at 9:15 pm.

## COUNTY CORNER

Hello Mohave County!

Here at the Mohave County Assessor's office, our staff members have been focusing on a very important issue that affects your property ownership: Deed Fraud.

Deed fraud was brought to my attention about four years ago. Due to some close calls, it was obvious we needed a fix or some sort of security for the property owners in Mohave County. My staff scrambled for a solution. We found a common denominator of deed fraud is the change of a property owner's mailing address. With this information it was evident a better control of one's mailing address could be possible. We created and started the first ever Assessor's Address Protection Program (AAPP). In order for the AAPP to work, a Mohave County property owner sign up in our office. The property owner is vetted through a notary and then we freeze the mailing address. This protects the property owners from fraud and allows for a better level of security for property transfers.

Since we implemented our AAPP program, we have signed up over 2,000 property owners. The program has worked so well our office received a state award and other counties in Arizona have implemented their own AAPP program. If you have not signed up for our AAPP program, I highly suggest you visit one of our offices (Kingman, Lake Havasu City or Bullhead City), bring your Identification for our notary and all addresses or parcel numbers you would want to be protected. There is a onetime \$50 fee to apply.

About a year or so after our program was unveiled, the State Legislature passed a bill that required the Recorder's Office to create a list to opt-in that would give you a notice if someone recorded a document in your name. This program is different than ours, but between both programs; Mohave County property owners are the most secure in Arizona with their property ownership.

None of these programs would be available today had the Mohave County Assessor's Office not taken an interest in protecting property ownership. Another first for the Mohave Assessors office is deed training. Last year we collaborated with the Arizona Attorney General's Office; Don Carrol, CFE, Criminal Investigator and Jesi L. Wolnik, Deed Fraud expert Attorney from Gilbert, Arizona to create training for Assessor and Recorder staff around the state. This tremendous training was an eye opener. Don and Jesi explained the different avenues the fraudsters take in stealing property and enabled us to know what to look for while transferring property. Mohave County's training last year was very successful. The Maricopa County Assessor hosted this same Deed Fraud training in Phoenix just last month. There were not only Assessors and Recorders in attendance, but also County Attorneys and even legislatures. With Representatives and Senators in attendance, both myself and the Maricopa Assessor were appointed to be on the Deed Fraud task force slated for this fall. This gives me hope that deed fraud legislation will be successful next year.

Your Representative: John Gillette and I tried to get some deed fraud bills passed this year. Unfortunately we were not successful in being heard in committee. We had big opponents that did not like some of our approaches. However, we are not deterred and we understand that many times it takes more than one try to get a bill passed. We also felt more communication with our now unveiled opponents could get us over the hump and allow us to be heard in committee next year. I will keep you all up to date on any bills that are supporting.

The Mohave County Assessor's office will continue to protect property owners in Mohave County in whatever way we can.

## 8 TIPS FOR BOATING SAFELY DURING STORMS

It is officially summer and with it come the chance of Monsoon storm activity. These storms build up rather quickly and can be severe. If you are on the lake and you see fast growing clouds, it's a good idea to get off the lake as soon as possible.

The Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD) wants to remind boaters about how they should react during a storm. When out on the water, weather conditions can change quickly and could be dangerous for unprepared boaters.

AZGFD offers the following eight tips for boaters to protect themselves and their passengers during a storm:

1. While life jackets are required for children 12 and younger, everyone should wear a life jacket at all times while on the water. Storms can create large waves that could knock a passenger from the boat.
2. Monitor the weather around you, and use a weather radio for updates from the National Weather Service. If storms are predicted or are building, pull your boat out of the water or consider postponing your outing.
3. Secure all gear above and below decks.
4. Keep everyone onboard away from electrical and ungrounded components. Remain as low in the boat as possible.
5. Slow down but keep enough power to maintain headway and steering.
6. Turn on your navigation lights.
7. If possible, head for the nearest shore that's safe to approach. It may be best to ride it out in open water rather than try to approach the shore in heavy wind and waves.
8. Boats should head the bow into the waves at a 45-degree angle. Personal watercrafts should head directly into the waves.

AZGFD offers free boater education courses that cover instruction on the basic skills required to safely operate a boat or personal watercraft, navigational rules, legal requirements and boating emergencies. The classes take place monthly in Phoenix and Lake Havasu City and are a great source of information for both new and veteran boaters.
